Greece and the Eastern Mediterranean have been, for millennia, a crossroads for migration, trade, and cultural exchange. Over the last decade, the region has once again become the epicenter of human mobility as millions of refugees from Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, and Sub-Saharan Africa, displaced by conflict, climate change and deprivation seek to reach the relative safety of Europe, with thousands having lost their lives in the effort. These migration flows have strained political relations and created extraordinary challenges for transit and host countries, in particular, Greece.
